

Upcoming Funding Initiatives

1. **SlingShot 2.0 Regional Plan Implementation** - Funds are allocated to Regional Planning Units for the purpose of implementation regional plans. For contact information in your regional contact Robin.purdy@seta.net
2. **Workforce Accelerator Fund 7.0** - *Estimated Date of RFA: October 2018- on the CWDB website now, applications due 12/3/2018 – accelerate system-wide changes to better address the challenges and barriers that keep Californians from achieving success in their professional lives. Provides funds for innovative services for target populations including immigrant job seekers and their families. Funding of up to \$150,000 for new accelerator projects.*
3. **SB1, Infrastructure and Apprenticeship** - *Estimated Date of RFA Release: January 2019*
4. **AB1111: Removing Barriers to Employment Act - Breaking Barriers to Employment Initiatives** - *Estimated Date of RFA Release: February 2019*
5. **Regional Accelerator** - *Estimated Date of RFA Release: February 2019. Will focus on scaling and replicating regional service strategies affecting target populations, including immigrants and their families.*
6. **SB 840 created the Youth Reinvestment Grant Program** at the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC). *Of the \$37.3 million, \$35.062 million must be awarded to local jurisdictions through a competitive grant process for implementing evidence-based, trauma-informed, culturally relevant, and developmentally appropriate diversion programs in underserved communities with high rates of juvenile arrests and high rates of racial/ethnic disproportionality within those juvenile arrests.
