

Adult Eligibility

Applicants for the ELL program must meet the following WIOA Adult eligibility criteria in order to receive services paid for with these funds

- Be 18 Years or older;
- If the individual is a male, born on or after January 1, 1960, he must meet the requirements for Military Selective Service Registration;
- Provide proof of the right to work in the U.S.;
- Demonstrate need for services beyond Basic Career Services to achieve employment;
- If employed, the individual must meet the local self-sufficiency standards, [Family income at or below the 200% of the Lower Living Standard Income Level (LLSIL) for San Diego County, based on their family size].
- Identify the Level of Priority of Service

Priority of Service Requirement

- Priority of service status is established at the time of eligibility determination and must be given to individuals enrolling as an Adult who are veterans, recipients of public assistance, other low-income individuals, or individuals who are basic skills deficient.

Subrecipients must deliver priority of service in the following order:

1st Priority – Veterans and eligible spouses (covered persons) who are:

- low income, or,
- recipients of public assistance, or,
- who are basic skills deficient.

2nd Priority – Individuals (non-covered persons) who are:

low income, or,

- recipients of public assistance, or,
- who are basic skills deficient.

3rd Priority – Veterans and eligible spouses who are:

- not low income, and,
- not recipients of public assistance, and,
- not basic skills deficient.
